Both Carol and Pat worked with tamariki who benefitted from the tautoko they provided ngā tauira with their learning. Having gained many of the skills required to be great teachers, they formalised their qualifications gaining their Bachelor of Education (Teaching). They always went the 'extra mile' to ensure all students were supported. Carol and Pat are respected by staff, parents and students, Both taking the time to get to know their students and their whānau.

All of Carol's children attended Clendon Park School. Carol would often be in school supporting teachers with noho, sports and many extra curricular activities.
