PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Road safety around our school is becoming increasingly worrying!

Most days we are receiving feedback from staff, parents, local residents and even some of our students about the lack of road safety awareness around our school.

Here are some reminders of what we expect from our students:

- Don't let your child walk to school alone unless you are sure that they are going to be able to do so safely. You should
 walk with them and teach them how to be safe first.
- The pedestrian crossing outside the school is the only place pedestrians have right of way.
- Children should never enter the school grounds through the staff car park area or ride scooters and bikes in this space.

If you have no choice but to bring your car please remember:

- Pull into a vacant parking spot so your child can safely exit the car. Stopping in the middle of the road so your child
 can jump out at the crossing is not ok it's very dangerous, especially for the cars behind you!
- Please don't stop your car in the middle of the road to allow students out of your car this is dangerous for cars
 travelling behind you and can give children false confidence that all cars will stop and allow them to cross. We
 continue to receive reports of children walking out in front of cars without checking please don't teach our children
 that this is OK!
- Please only park in designated parking spots and never across a neighbour's driveway even if it's "just for a minute".
- Do not park on the footpath or grass berms!
- Never call your child from across the road. We expect all students and parents to use our pedestrian crossing.


