Accountability



A daily register of attendance will be kept.



STUDY CENTRE PROGRAMMES

Your child will work daily on completing her/his set classroom tasks during Study Centre hours.

In addition to this, students will be taught a wide range of Information Technology skills such as:

- Accessing websites to gain information they need to complete projects
- Using the internet
- Using e-mail
- Word and Publishing skills
- Planning projects of work
- Information retrieval skills
- Presentation skills
- Library skills

Your child will work in a highly supportive environment.

Students who need special help will be catered for. Time will be set aside to assist these students to develop enhanced reading, writing and maths skills.

There will be close liaison between your child's classroom teacher and Study Centre staff, so that all special needs are catered for on an individual basis.
