PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The chill of the colder months is starting to bite, and doctors are already seeing an "uptick" in the usual winter illness culprits. Health officials are urging Kiwis to prepare early ahead of winter, to avoid "extra pressure" on the health services during the worst of cold and flu season.

Influenza

Symptoms of the flu can include cough, high temperature, chills, sore throat, a runny, or congested nose, fatigue, and an upset stomach.

These can also be symptoms of Covid-19, so it's recommended you test for Covid if you have any of these. If you have a cold or flu, the advice is to rest at home and drink plenty of fluids to stay hydrated.

Covid-19

This will be our fifth winter with Covid-19, and while the virus hasn't settled into a seasonal pattern, it's among illnesses that can spread easily as people spend more time indoors when the temperature drops. If you test positive for Covid-19, Health New Zealand recommends you isolate until your symptoms are clear to prevent further spread.

Earlier this week, the National Public Health Service advised that Covid-19 is still "very much present" in our communities, and a "significant health risk".

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

Symptoms of RSV infections tend to look also like a cold or Covid-19, such as:

*a runny nose

*coughing

*sneezing

*fever (high temperature)

*wheezing and difficulty breathing

*not feeling like eating or, in babies, difficulty feeding due to breathlessness.

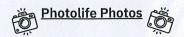
Healthify says that in very young infants with RSV, the only symptoms may be irritability, decreased activity, and breathing difficulties.

Most infections go away on their own in 1-2 weeks, and there's no specific treatment. Care at home involves relieving symptoms, such as managing pain and fever with paracetamol, and drinking fluids to prevent dehydration.

Whooping cough

Whooping cough, a "very infectious" condition, is also currently in Aotearoa. Whooping cough, an infection caused by bacteria, causes bouts of "intense" coughing and trouble breathing. It's sometimes referred to as the '100 day cough', as the cough may continue for three months. Whooping cough can cause serious illness and sometimes death in babies, young children and older adults, and on average, each infected person passes it to 12 others. Your immune system will get rid of the bacteria after 3-4 weeks without any treatment, but the damage caused to breathing tubes takes longer to repair, Healthify says.

If whooping cough is diagnosed early in infection, a doctor may prescribe antibiotics, to help reduce spread of the disease.

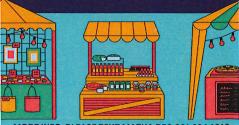

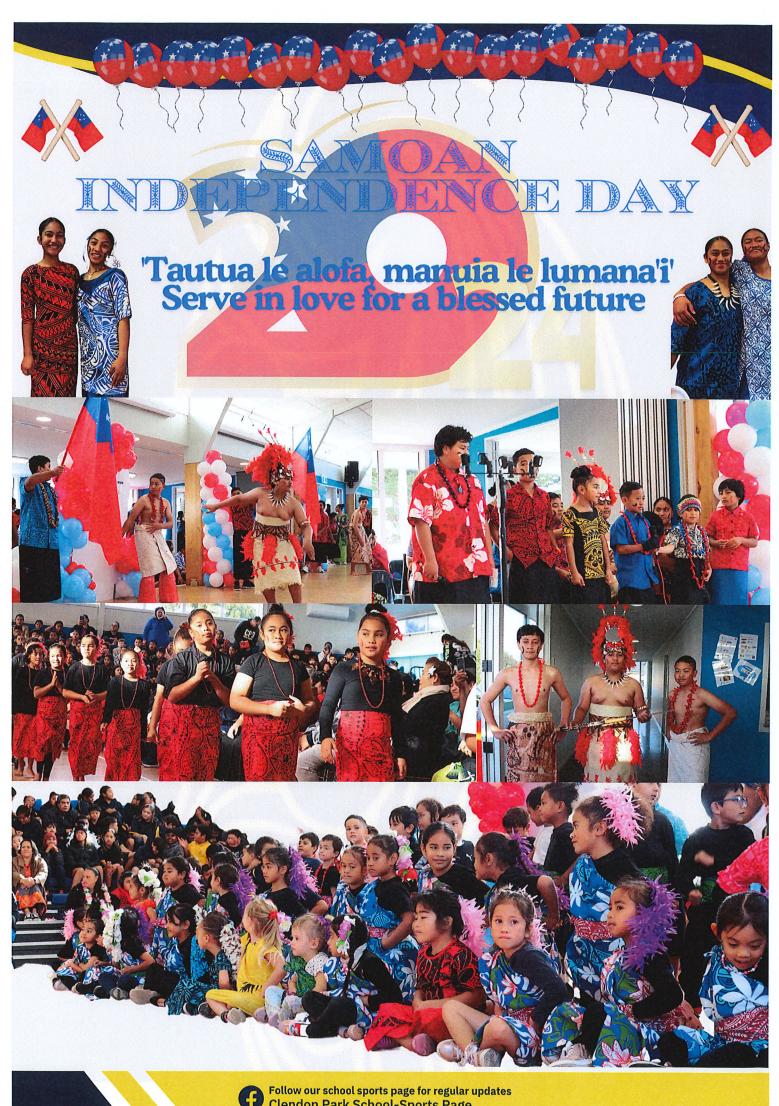

A huge shout out to (Year8) Vilisoni for standing up to umpire today, also for co-coaching with (Year7) Tauro.

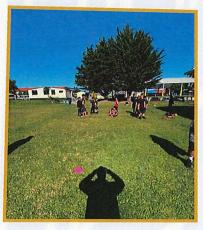
