# **Clendon Park School Road Safety Policy**

## **Purpose**

To ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students, staff, and whanau by promoting safe, lawful, and respectful driving and parking behaviours around Clendon Park School.

#### Scope

This policy applies to all parents, caregivers, staff, contractors, and visitors within the immediate school environment, particularly during pick-up and drop-off times.

## **Key Traffic Law Infringements**

- Failing to use a pedestrian crossing Pedestrians must use the zebra crossing where one is available. Crossing outside creates unsafe habits for children.
- Parking on or too close to a pedestrian crossing Vehicles must not stop or park within 6 metres of a crossing.
- Parking across or in private driveways It is illegal to obstruct any driveway or entrance.
- Parking on the footpath Vehicles must not park on or partly on the footpath. Footpaths are for pedestrians, not vehicles.
- Parking or stopping on yellow lines or 'No Stopping' areas This obstructs traffic and limits visibility.
- Leaving the car idling or unattended It is unsafe and illegal to leave a running vehicle unattended.

## **Policy Guidelines**

- Crossing the Road: All parents, caregivers, and students are expected to use the designated zebra crossing. Teachers will encourage correct crossing behaviour.
- Parking and Pick-Up Areas: Do not park on the footpath, across driveways, within 6 metres of crossings or corners, on yellow lines, or in 'No Stopping' zones. Use only designated pick-up and drop-off areas. If you think your convenience is more important than the safety of our children, we will speak with you or take still images and send them to authorities.
- Courtesy and Respect: Treat staff on duty with respect. Be mindful of residents' driveways and property access.
- Vehicle Idling: Turn off engines when waiting to reduce emissions and noise pollution.

#### **Education and Communication**

The school will provide regular reminders through newsletters, social media, and signage. Classroom learning and student-led road patrols will reinforce safe road behaviour.

## **Enforcement and Collaboration**

The school will work with Auckland Transport and NZ Police School Community Officers to monitor road safety, provide education, and install appropriate signage and markings.

## Campaigns and Initiatives

Initiatives such as 'Park Smart – Keep Tamariki Safe' and 'Footpaths Are for Feet' will promote awareness. Parents are encouraged to use Park & Walk options and sign a Parent Safety Pledge at the start of each year.

## Review

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure alignment with current road safety standards and community needs.
